

Strengthen the SWB's enforcement powers to stop illegal water diversions and would sharply increase fines for violators.


Prevent violation that occurred in Shasta River Watershed when farmers & ranchers defied curtailment orders.

• Grant SWB new, sweeping authority to issue interim relief orders without hearing.

• Impose new costly requirements.

• SWB ability to curtail diversions, impose new minimum streamflow requirements.

• Allow SWB to increase fish flows, direct reservoir operations, and require new technical studies.



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AB1137

OPPOSE

Clarify that the State Water Board has authority to issue curtailment orders for all diverters, including **Senior Right Holders**.

Drafted in response to a recent decision, suggesting it is up to the Legislature to determine if it is time to update curtailment laws.

- regulations.

• Authorize the SWB to adopt wide-ranging

• Curtailment to water use under ANY CLAIM of right, including senior water rights.

• SWB can eliminate hearings before issuing curtailments as they see fit.

• Ultimately eliminating due process.

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

• Placed the burden of proving the basis of the right on the right holder Made it much easier for the State Water Board to determine that a water right holder forfeited

 Only allow the State Water Board to request information from a water right holder • Not enhance SWB enforcement authority.



Expedited permitting process for water supply and flood risk reduction projects, and ensure critical water infrastructure projects are built at the appropriate pace and scale.

• Reform the process for Section 401 permits.

• Require review and approval of 401 and Lake and Streambed alteration Agreements to be completed within 180 days.

• Avoid duplicative planning efforts.

• Allow project applicants to voluntary contribute resources to allow for additional resources to meet permitting requirements.

MAKING **CONSERVATION A** WAY OF LIFE

On August 18 the SWRCB initiated the formal rulemaking for Making Conservation a California Way of Life (Regulation) and released draft regulatory text intended to implement bills passed by the Legislature in 2018 to develop a regulatory framework to achieve long-term water use efficiency.


ARREARAGES

LOW INCOME HOUSEHOLD WATER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

On July 10, the governor signed a budget trailer bill expanding the Arrearages Program by extending the COVID Relief Period to provide payments for the period starting March 4, 2020 through Dec. 31, 2022.

• The extension covers both water and wastewater arrears.

• California department of Community Services and Development is evaluating the potential for further extension of the program.





Tuolumne-Stanislaus IRWMA received funding through their DAC Drinking Water Reliability Project






Fill Station Overview
